Challenges industry face

- Lack of logistics and equipment
- •Does not have dedicated **technical resource** persons
- •Inadequate **Safety Measures** (i.e., Fire Fighting, Evacuation plan, etc.)
- Weak OHS observance
- Commercial auditing & Certification fee is too high for SMEs to bear
- •Investment in compliance infrastructure doesn't give tangible benefit immediately
- No compulsion to follow Compliance those who operate emerging & local market



How COEL is responding

- COEL has developed a compliance cell, ready to serve the industry
- Equipped with certified fire fighting trainers & two lead auditors
- Has developed a Compliance guidelines in consultation with WRAP & INTERTEK
- Implementing LFMEAB's CFS program

COEL's Compliance services includes:

- 1. Training & workshop on compliance provision
- 2. Developing resource persons
- 3. Compliance audit
- 4. Strategic support for development & maintaining compliance
- 5. Assistance to prepare operational manuals



Services COEL has been providing

Organized **10** compliance **training and workshops**, **359** participants have attended from different leather factories

Distributed 5,500 Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to **14** factories under LFMEAB, BTA, BPPS & LTSE



Under CFS has been directly working with 130 factories to help become compliant
